

Princess Diana Serviceberry *Amelanchier x grandiflora* 'Princess Diana'

Description: A tree for all seasons: clouds of pure white flowers in early spring, abundant purplish fruits in summer, excellent orange and red fall color, and a handsome, wide-spreading winter silhouette. Young plants grow vigorously, often blooming in their third year. A great native habitat tree.

Mature height: 20' to 25'

Leaves: 2" long, turning red-yellow-orange in autumn. Clean summer foliage.

Bark: Smooth, light gray.

Flowers: Spectacular white flowers, purple edible fruit.

Habitat: Hardy zones 4 to 9. Tolerant of a wide range of soils. Easily grown in full sun to part shade.

Fun Facts: The small, showy purple berries attract birds, are safe for human consumption, and can be used to make delicious jam or pie.
